OPERATION DROP BOX 2022 Revised.

1. Situation:

a. The movie 2000 Mules and the **stuffing of** ballot boxes has clearly demonstrated that our electoral system is very susceptible to illegal activity. Significant information shows that there is a global network apparently well organized to pick up fake ballots from phony non-profits and deliver them to ballot boxes, usually between 12 Midnight and 6:00 am.

b. Our The Patriot community here in Yavapai County will be conducting a **surveillance only** operation to watch the drop boxes to record and document suspicious activity, which may or could be used as evidence in a potential future criminal cases.

c. We are asking for groups of volunteers at each drop box in Yavapai County. This is an around the clock operation of two person teams for two-hour intervals

2, Objective:

Our objective is to post up Patriot volunteers to observe and report any suspicious activity at all drop boxes in the county. We are to gather any evidence that can be turned over to local Law Enforcement for potential use in a criminal prosecution of election fraud. This will entail the use of video recording devices that can be saved and archived for the County Attorney. No such videos or recordings are to be used in any inappropriate manner which may or could be in violation of any individuals' rights of privacy. I.e: Nothing is to be posted to any public sources whatsoever or shared with anyone other than law enforcement. Period

3. Opportunity:

a. We are preparing a roster of volunteers who would be willing to station themselves at every drop box in the county for a two-hour shift. This will require a drop box location team leader to control the roster, recruit volunteers and set the schedule for that box.

We also need to coordinate with the County Sheriff and local Police Departments to notify them of our intentions. As well as local governments because of locations.

<u>* Rules of Engagement</u> – Under no circumstances will any volunteer interfere with anyone placing ballots in the drop box. This is an observe and report only operation! If it appears someone places a significant number of ballots in the box, then record the event and get a description of the individual and their vehicle and license plate number, if at all possible. This could easily be accomplished by photo, video is even better. Avoid any and all interaction if at all possible. Remaining in your vehicle is strongly advised and in fact insisted on. If a citizen drops off only one or two ballot and approaches you as to why you are watching the box, you may offer an explanation. Be friendly and professional and stay vigilant. Avoid confrontation at all costs, yet you do have a legal right to defend yourself. Do not initiate any confrontation. Immediately notify 911 and request Law Enforcement assistance if needed. If required, move yourself to a safe location and Report as soon as possible to The Lions of Liberty or YCPT. At the end of each shift, Patriots will prepare brief report of activity and transmit it to box team leader by email.

b. All volunteer teams are to follow these instructions.

c. Coordinating Instructions – A daily report after your team's shift is over are to be sent to the Lions of Liberty through box team leader of each location of activity reported by all shifts.

4. Service and Support:

All volunteers of the surveillance teams will be responsible for their own travel to and from drop box locations. Also provide for their own food and water and of course an emergency/medical kit should always be in everyone's vehicles. Volunteers are responsible for their own method of recording devices, pens and paper.

5. Communications:

We suggest you have your cell phones fully charged. Be certain to dial/call 911 in an emergency as your first contact in the event of any threat of intimidation or confrontation.
